PARENTING AWARENESS MONTH ESSAY CONTEST GUIDELINES

- 1) **The contest is open only to third-grade students (or equivalent) in Charlevoix and Emmet counties.**
- 2) **The essays should be one-page minimum and not exceed two handwritten pages. Please submit as written.**
- 3) **The topic must be “What Makes Your Family Strong?”**
- 4) **These should be sent together as a class no later than February 1st. Please be sure each essay can be identified (e.g., name or student number). Include a submission form found on our website that includes the classroom teacher’s name, school, address, phone number, and email.**

- Photo Release Form: only required if your students’ essays is a winner or honorable mention. A parent or guardian must sign the release form.

All students will receive a participation certificate. (Bonus: If you email an excel list of your students’ names, I will complete the certificates for you!) Winners, honorable mentions, and their families will receive an invitation to an award ceremony on **March 21st**.
